

All one night, in the middle of the week, we built a roll bar out of chrome moly tubing, without the use of any bending equipment, and installed it in my TC. It looked a little strange, being all angles, but it proved to be satisfactory during my roll bar test in 1961. All of this was done while I was employed full time, sometimes working 60 hours a week.

I bring this all up only because since I retired I find myself with very little time to do all of the above. I think there is a definite corollary between age and time. It definitely goes faster as you age. I still get up a 4:30 AM as I did for many years, but by the time I have my breakfast and read all three papers time has gone by. Then I have to look at my computer to see what inane comments have appeared on the TABC list etc. When I go into the garage I can't seem to spend more then a couple of hours before my back gives out. It also used to give out in the old days but I didn't pay any attention to it then.

What I haven't mentioned yet is that now I have time for my avocation which is music. I have been an amateur musician for many years. Now I am retired I have become a semi-professional and play all the time in rehearsal bands. I also have time to visit grand kids something I didn't even have in the old days. I wouldn't trade my present situation for anything..



ther A/H 3000 with a bad tire). In Cambria we were joined by Guild






