

The things that I remember were mostly associated with trips, conclaves, etc. You had to remember the rules about Harvey: If he was at the rear of the group, everybody drove to fast and he couldn't keep up—if he was at the front, it was pedal to the metal. When I toured with them, he never had a radio, so it was almost impossible for the tour leader to keep track of him! Rule # 3—if Harvey was backing up, get your car out of the way, get out and watch—something interesting was sure to happen! I distinctly remember Harvey backing into a sturdy fence at a conclave at Sky Ranch—he broke the fence and twisted up his luggage rack. The fence was stacked back together and part of a day was spent fixing the luggage rack—the people at Sky Ranch never knew anything about it!

At one stop, there was a sign behind the front desk advertising special rates that week and I overheard Harvey arguing with the desk clerk that he should be entitled to that rate, even though we had all made the reservation and paid for the room months before. I have a hunch he won. But even if he didn't, I know he took it in good humor. Because that's how Harvey was. Good natured but very *careful*.
