Some members brought memorabilia from TCMG's early days. For instance, Stan and Esther Belland brought a TC Motoring Guild version of the board game Monopoly which was used during an early weekend trip to Big Bear Lake.

David Edgar had researched the archives and put together a program of photographs covering meetings in the Community Room over the decades. David arranged the photos in chronological order. Watching them reminded me of just how long this club has existed. The meeting room décor changed over the years, the seating arrangement we used changed several times, and hair and clothing fashions evolved. There were pictures of past Executive Councils and pictures of members dressed in imaginative costumes for the Halloween parties. Through it all, it was obvious that we have had good times in the Community Room.

Too soon the meeting was drawing to an end. We all

end. We all gathered for a group photograph, cleaned up the room, turned out the lights, and locked the door. Those of us who had driven our TCs started them up, and, heading east, worked our way down the main street of town, went through the last stop light, and the TC Motoring Guild left Montrose for the last time.

But as one chapter in TCMG's history closes, a new chapter opens. The night of April 25 will see the first meeting at our new location. After considering many possibilities, a room at the 36th Church of Christ located at 4032 Whitsett Ave. in Studio City emerged as the new home of the TC Motoring Guild.

Will we be meeting in our new location 59 years from now? No one can know, but wouldn't it be something if 59 years from now Brianna and Anthony Hanes, now both 12 years old and our youngest active family members, could be telling future TCMG members about the move from Montrose to Studio City?

I hope to see you in Studio City on April 25. The theme of the program that night will be, appropriately, "All Things New". Until then, continue wearing out the roads!


