

March 11 Tour to Andres Pico Adobe

On Sunday, March 11 we visit Andres Pico Adobe, named for Pio Pico (Pico Blvd) built in 1834 and one of the oldest adobe structures in Los Angeles. For those who come hungry, we start our day with lunch at a nearby restaurant before caravanning to the Adobe. Once there, we'll enjoy a private guided tour of the various structures on the grounds.

In addition to the adobe, we will see an original 1904 redwood structure from Isaac Lankershim's (Lankershim Blvd) ranch, which used to cover half of the San Fernando Valley. Some of the original furnishings from the Lankershim Ranch offices are displayed, including an ornately-carved desk and a scale used to weigh the output from the Lankershim gold mine in California.





We will also explore a 1914 Southern Pacific Railroad flagman's shanty which was used at the intersection of Maclay Street and the tracks in San Fernando until 1948. Today it showcases railroad memorabilia.

Buckle, Alf Knight and Cyril Polley. During the TC era, Sailor worked at the front of the body line, installing the tubs onto the chassis at the first station. Maggie and Cyril fitted the bonnets, and Alf Knight attached the front wings.

Tom has done extensive research on the MG factory and talked to previous assembly line workers or their relatives to get insights.






