MIDGET CHASSIS May 2018

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As a youngster, living in the mid-west, my family practiced an annual ritual called "Spring Cleaning". Without a specific schedule, that process took place around the vernal equinox (i.e., the First Day of Spring) and included such things as replacement of storm windows (with screens), transplanting geranium flower plants (that had survived the cold winter in our basement), cleaning/painting rusty iron railing, etc. As I recall, my Mother was very adamant that all Spring Cleaning be completed no later than the First Day of Spring.

Now, as an adult living in California, I don't give much thought to "Spring Cleaning". Recently, however, a funny thing happened to me on my way to resolving a front brake problem on our TC. The car was placed on a jack-stand and the left-front wheel had been removed. As I gazed at this situation (and pondered the question of which tool to pick up next) my eyes became fixed on the leaf spring shackle and its dried, and worn, rubber bushings. In an instant, and for reasons that I cannot explain, I decided to replace those bushings, and worry about the front brake problem later. That decision immediately answered the question about the next tool requirement and, before too long, the shackle had been disassembled! This disassembly process required that I get pretty "close and personal" with a very rusty (and partly undercoated) leaf spring. With very little encouragement, but with some childhood training, I immediately decided that the dirty old leaf spring needed a thorough cleaning. You know, a "Spring Cleaning"!

Now, since a leaf spring cannot be properly cleaned (and painted) unless removed from the car, and since both right and left springs required the same reconditioning, both were removed and subjected to the same "Spring Cleaning". This difficult part of the project (i.e., removal, cleaning and painting) required over a week to complete. Re-installation of the refurbished springs (the fun part of the project) required only one day to complete. Although not specifically scheduled for a particular date, that reinstallation happened to fall on March 20, the First Day of Spring. My Mother would have been proud!

I hope that you are all doing some kind of "Spring Cleaning" too. Even though you may have missed the First Day of Spring, it is never too late to keep your TCs clean and ready for the road!



The formal award presentation was conducted late afternoon with the winning car for each class being brought forward to drive across the red carpet to receive a coveted trophy. It was certainly a proud moment **8** for the TC and Doug Pelton.




