Fall has arrived, evening temperatures are dropping, leaves are falling, pumpkin

patches have opened and Halloween candy is everywhere. So what are our UK counterparts looking forward to this month? It appears the American fascination for ghosts, goblins and witches has crossed the pond and Halloween is enjoyed with favorite candies including Maltese's, Aero, Cadbury Dairy Milk, Turkish Delight, and Wine Gums

What traditional celebrations are observed each fall in the UK? The theme seems to be death Halloween shortened from "All Hallows' Eve", has its origins in pagan festivals with people believing that, in the fall, the spirits of dead came alive and walked among the living. Therefore it was important to dress in costume to blend in with the dead and avoid being harmed by the spirits. Today in the UK Halloween is also known as Mischief Night, Nut-cracked Night, Snap Apple Night, and Thump-the-door Night.

November 1st is All Saints' Day and November 2nd is All Souls' Day, also known as Hollowtide, and are linked to Halloween. All Saints' Day is a chance to remember the saints who dedicated their lives to Christianity. All Souls' Day is an opportunity to celebrate departed family members and friends. While many of us are familiar with Day of the Dead celebrations, Celtic tradition included bonfires being lit at night in order to light the souls' way to heaven. There was also a superstition that All Souls' night was a time that the dead revisited their homes. Therefore some people would leave lit candles outside their homes to help guide the deceased souls.

Additionally, Soul Cakes were baked by the rich households and distributed to the poor of the parish. Soul cakes are an English spice cake (something like a hot cross bun), sometimes known simply as 'souls'. On All Hallows' Eve, All

Saints' Day and All Souls'

Day, children went 'souling', from house to house, asking for soul cake: quite possibly a precursor to trick or treating.

Some combine these holidays by having a bonfire, dressing up in spooky costumes, carving vegetables for lanterns, apple bobbing, and going door-to-door for treats. None of these are "bank holidays" in the UK, rather just observances by the public.

With this said, come to our October meeting and see how TCMG celebrates Halloween.

Was Running Great, and Then . . .

Cliff Lemieux was drivng his TC to the September TCMG meeting (a little over 65 miles one way), but it did not quite make it. It was running great when he picked up his friend, Bob, as well as cruised down the 118, holding it's own in the freeway traffic. But, engine trouble started when coming down Topanga, and as soon as they hit Ventura Blvd. in Canoga Park, Cliff decided to finally call it "quits." Trouble shooting later in the week showed no (zero/nix/nada) compression in cylinders 1&2!

Cliff called in the professionals and they found a blown head gasket between cylinders 1 and 2. Fairly simple fix but they also found the head was cracked between those cylinders and probably what caused the gasket to go. The head is now being stitched up.

Note there is only about a quarter inch beteen the cylinders at this point,





as well as other narrow spaces between water passages and the cylinders in other locations.



Every year, the Foster Children's Resource Center gives a new set of clothing and school supplies to about 2,400 kids. It's a big occasion in a life without many big




occasions. But the best moment for these. often lonely and buffeted kids is when they are

Sandra calls us to order
