

This is TC 0252, the very first TC out the factory production track on Sept 17, 1945, 75 years ago. So we are celebrating 75 years of TCs. TC 0251 was the prototype and we only have 1945 listed as when it was built. The factory cranked out 15 TCs that first day and then set aside production for 10 days possibly to work out any kinks in the assembly line they found. That or there was a parts supply problem. Not sure.

Pete deBruyn of the TCMG and in New York, owns TC 0252 which is pictured above.

When this was brought up on the TABC List, it started a discussion on exactly what the build date is. Is it when the car started down the production track or when it came off the track at the end? Tom Wilson said he recently came across a clue and will pursue it. Pete deBruyn shared a photo of TC 0257 still on the line on Sept 20th, (see page 3) so if date is accurate that then it must mean build date is at the start of the track since TCs 0252-0266 are listed with a build date of Sept 17.

t has been 96 years since the first M.G.s were born, and 40 years

knew what revolutions the new,


as it began rolling out of the factory doors. And who at Abingdon could have dreamed that thousands of them would still be driving the open road so many years later?

Officially it was September 17, 1945 when a new, shiny black sports car caught its first glimmer of sunlight. TC0252 was the first production TC built, the only other being TC0251 which was the prototype, created from a modified TB chassis. So what is the oldest surviving production

TC? Believe it or not, it's TC0252 which is currently owned by TCMG member Pete deBruyn in New York. And the youngest surviving car of the 10,001 (including the prototype) made? That would be TC10251, the very last one off the line, and at the ripe young age of

71 is now reported to be living in Northen Ireland. I wonder if the two will ever meet?

This photo was supplied to us by Pete deBruyn. Pete describes it as of TC 0257 on Sept 20th, 1945. This TC is listed as being built on the first day of production on Sept 17, 1945. This confirms the build date must be when it started down the chassis assembly track. From the chassis track it then goes to the body track.



What Are Earl Sargent Points?



The Earl Sargent "Use it or Lose it" Award

Earl Sargent was a devoted TCMG member who drove his TC whenever possible, showed his TC (Even winning at Pebble Beach Concours), and raced his TC. What more could you do with a TC?

After his passing, our club established a perpetual award in 1991 in his name, and awards it to a member each year that participated the most in TCMG activities with their TC.

Various methods were used over the years to determine the winner, but we now employ the following points system.

The Earl Sargent Memorial Trophy is awarded to the TCMG member who accumulates the most points for driving their TC to various TCMG club activities. Points are accumulated each year starting the day after our Annual Holiday Party until the next year's Holiday Party. Points for the trophy are awarded to TCMG members in the following manner:

- Two points are awarded for attending TCMG driving events, including long distance events such as Annual Conclaves and GoF West, with an MG TC. (One point if TC is housed at event location and not driven, but it must be displayed)
- One point is awarded for attending TCMG club meetings with an MG TC. (TC must be parked at meeting, not on trailer)
- Driving a TC to and from an event or meeting will yield a 25% bonus for distances over 100 miles each way, or 50% for more than 500 miles each way. Mileage is calculated by actual distance driven to event, not by shortest possible route.
- Attending an event spanning three or more days will award a half point bonus (must attend entire event or all major activities with TC to qualify). This bonus is a fixed amount, not increased by distance bonus.
- One point is awarded for attending Tech Sessions (those which are listed officially in the TCMG calendar) with your TC.
- The memorial service for any TCMG member is considered a club affair, therefore one point is awarded for attending in a TC, so long as the service is announced to the club by print or email beforehand.
- At the discretion of the TCMG council, partial points may be awarded for failed attempts (i.e. break downs), to bring a TC to any of the aforementioned activities.

Ties are broken by total number of driving events and meetings attended with a TC. In the event there is still a tie, driving events shall weigh more heavily than meetings. If the parties tied have each achieved 100% attendance at all official TCMG activities for the year, then all tie breaker rules are disregarded and a tie is announced.

TCMG Zoom Meeting Minutes - Aug 25, 2020

ue to the Coronavirus Pandemic and state-wide restrictions on social gatherings TCMG members agreed to conduct the August meeting via ZOOM. The meeting was initiated and expertly hosted by member Mike Simmons.

The August Meeting of the TC Motoring Guild was called to order at 6:14 p.m. by the President, Steve Simmons. The earlierthan-usual start time was again arranged to accommodate those members who joined the meeting from earlier time zones.

Meeting attendance was taken by Joyce Edgar from the ZOOM visual display showing attendance of 21 memberships represented with 31 attendees. Three members joined the TCMG meeting from out of state (Maryland, New Hampshire, and Washington State); with Jim Sullivan attending for the first time. Five members were credited with driving their "simulated journey" to the virtual meeting to qualify for Sargent points. Joyce will forward the attendance sheet to Don McLish via email.

Reports

Minutes - Secretary Cliff Lemieux reported that the minutes of July 28th meeting were published in the September newsletter, and asked if there were any additions or corrections. None were recommended. Hence, the July minutes were approved as written.

Treasurer Report - Joyce Edgar reported that expenditures for August were minimal: only an \$8 expense for the month, and the \$100 rent credit for the church meeting facility still remains. The TCMG Financial Membership Report of 8/24/20 was previously submitted to board members for review, and is available to all via email upon request.

Programs - Joyce announced that the post-meeting program is a slide show that she prepared using photos sent in by a few members, and old photos that she already has. Other programs that she has available involve video presentations, but owing to the limitations of the current ZOOM format we may be limited to slide presentations for the time being. However, she has more photos that may be presented in the same format during the September meeting.

Joyce solicited alternate program ideas from the membership. Mike Simmons volunteered to explore the possibility of setting up video for presentations during future meetings.

The program for the October meeting at the Simon Car Museum is still pending due to uncertainty in meeting in-person in the future.

Events. Richard Loe updated the status of events which are planned for the nearterm:

The Queens English event this year is still tentatively scheduled for September 27th. If Woodley Park is to be opened, it will be known after September 1st. If the event is changed, Richard indicated that an alternate activity will be planned.

The Conclave for October 3-5 is still scheduled as planned.

New Business

Holiday Party - Linda Simmons reported that tentative reservations have been arranged at the Tam O'Shanter for lunch on Sunday, December 6th from 11am to 3pm (with the possibility to extend to no later than 3:30). It was mutually agreed that time and place were acceptable. Prices and meal offerings will be determined later, however, for a large party, only plated dinners (salad/entrée/ desert) will be offered – no sandwiches.

Future In-Person Meetings - Church services are not yet being held, but they just opened the meeting room with COVID restrictions: separated seating, but no cleaning crew available, so



meeting participants will be responsible disinfecting surfaces, etc. Under those conditions, and the lack of adequate ventilation, Steve considers it too soon to resume meeting at the church facility now.

With no further business the meeting was adjourned at 6:33 pm for the follow-on program.

The follow-on program was a slide presentation of photos and of members sharing stories of "Memories New & Old".

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
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
