The sign actually wasn't used much during the war, but it perfectly exemplified the spirit of the British people in a time of crisis. They were challenged to make-do, to improvise, to persevere. Their lives were up-ended, they feared death and dying all around

them, their economy was in shambles. Today, 80 years later, we in the TCMG still drive one of the ways that the British devised to get back onto that road to recovery.

Today's pandemic is not even close to the crisis that the British faced, but there are analogues. We now have to adapt to new rules and behaviors: wear a mask, wash your hands, keep your

distance, no gathering. Everything except essential services (and big-box stores) are unavailable, including our favorite restaurants, meeting places, and churches. But, just like Kimber at MG, who adapted their business plan to quickly ramp up production and sales of the new TC's, we made some adaptations, too.

With the loss of our meeting place, we took advantage of a new internet capability to meet on-line with the help of President Steve Simmons and technoguru Mike Simmons; the change resulted in almost 100% increase in meeting participation, almost twice as many TC's driven "to meetings," and members across the country participating from 7 states – CA to NH, WA to TX. Pandemic restrictions shut down almost all regular

car shows and events, so Richard Loe devised monthly driving events where we could all participate together, and "social distance" at the same time. And with all of members participating, the social distances weren't just 6 feet; they were miles, tens-of-miles, hundreds-of-miles, THOUSANDS-OF-MILES! Members Ernie and Elizabeth Page joined in from Scotland along with others from various states across the country. With more members participating in more events, the total number of Sargent points accumulated were almost twice as many

as the previous year. And thanks to David Edgar all the events were acknowledged and documented in the "Chassis" that continued unfailingly to go out to keep us all up to date.

We didn't get together for the Annual Holiday Party because all the restaurants were shut down, but despite our loss of camaraderie the

donations for our charity reached the stratosphere, again with out-of-state members contributing, too.

We all adapted pretty well; we managed to Keep Calm and Carry On.

We look forward to a new year of activity despite the restrictions still imposed. They still haven't restricted auto travel, so we will continue to meet on-line every month and to plan as many driving events as possible while maintaining safe distances until were all vaccinated. Fortunately, our TC's were built for safe distancing – the bonnet is about 6 feet long. Safety Fast.



Ethanol Petrol in our TCs

Rob Zucca finally got his TC engine running (the one featured here in previous issues). But he is experiencing fuel issues where fuel is bubbling out of the carb jet upon shut off. He also experienced terrible gas milage (about 10 mpg) on one trip. Everything seems spot on spec wise with assembly. One of the thought was our fuel containing ethanol is causing the problem. But this answer was interesting (although not solving Rob's issue).

This talk about alcohol in the fuel is missing a couple of points. Firstly alcohol was always considered usable as a fuel, indeed it was considered a good fuel pre-war and used a

lot for racing and record breaking without a hint of any of the problems we are so concerned about nowadays. Remember Cleveland Discol? It was common in the 50s over here and was advertised "with IPA"; Iso Propyl Alcohol. This may have a different effect to the ethyl alcohol which we distil from vegetation these days but I can't help thinking that alcohol in fuel is not the bogyman that we make it out to be. I believe Paul Ireland found as much in his study. I seem to remember that MG themselves recommended it to be used for the higher stages of tune described in their works XPAG tuning booklet. The other thing is that our engines were designed

in the late thirties to run on a much lower octane than that found today. It was around 70 octane I believe. Thus removing alcohol and thus lowering the octane ratio may not be such a problem

unless you are running a much higher compression ratio.

Troubleshooting Tech Session

On January 17, 2021 the TC Motoring Guild had a tech session focusing on Rob Zucca's fuel bubbling issue on the new engine in his TC. It was announced on our club group email and 18 members were present. It was recorded and the running time is just under 2 1/2 hours.

The first few minutes are a bit rough with technical difficulties, and in segments where the engine is running the audio is poor. A few sections have been edited out due to audio and technical issues.

Lighting Up the TC Facia Gauges



Thave always been disappointed with the lighting of my dash instruments. I don't often drive at night, but when

I do, my dash instruments are noticeably missing. One of the first things I did to the dash was change the bulbs to LED's but that didn't make much of a difference. Also, the bulbs often did not make good contact in the holder and would not consistently stay lit.

The other day it occurred to me that flexible LED strip light that could wrap around the instrument and fit more closely

to the opening for lighting might be a better solution. I found what I was looking for at SuperBrightLEDs.com and got to work. I chose a natural color dimmable strip.

The first thing I wanted to do was find a way to support the LED strip firmly around the instruments while still allowing them to be easily

removed. I found everything I needed at ACE hardware. For the smaller instruments a 2" PVC coupling fitting was just the right diameter. All I needed to do was trim off a piece the width of the light strip. For the speedo and tach I bought an aluminum strip that I could trim and bend to the curve of the instrument. Next I used my Dremel tool to router out the back of the dash around the speedo and tach so the light strip could fit more closely to the instruments light window.


I planned out and soldered the wiring to the light strips before attaching them to their holders. I used contact cement to attach the two rings for the smaller instruments to the metal instrument cluster. A slight bending to the instruments hold down strap allows the strap to rest on the light ring to further secure it to the panel.



I used cabinet corner glides as angle brackets to hold the aluminum strips in place around the tach and speedo. The only thing that occurred to me as I was putting this together is to be careful when attaching the light strip to the aluminum backing to be sure the solder pots on the light strip

don't ground out on the aluminum. They are exposed front and back, however, the glue strip on the back seems to insulate the strip. Just to be safe I wrapped black tape around the end of the aluminum before attaching the strip but didn't think about doing that at the middle as well. A continuity test showed

no path there so I let it go.



I now have beautifully lit instruments that are dimmable.



REPORTS


