For some, our tour of the Reagan Library event began with a morning bite to eat at a local cafe. Others met at the library where four TCs got to park close by to the picnic tables and library entrance. TCMG member Rob Zucca has worked at the library for 19 years designing and building displays and led us on a tour of the latest displays on the FBI. As an added bonus he placed eight TC items within the displays as a scavenger hunt for us. Those items blended in quite well and even some of the library docents did not realize it. See photo evidence on these pages. And then Rob took us to a part of the museum that normal visitors do not have access to. In 2003 the original Situation Room at the White House was torn out to build a more technology advanced room. Everything from the original room (tables, chairs, wall panels, TV monitors, clocks, microphones, ceiling tiles, floor tiles, etc) was packed up and brought to the Reagan Library. Rob and team recreated the room in exact detail. It is now used for Leadership and Problem Solving Training. Team is given an initial scenario to work through. Outcomes will change based on their decisions. They then discover what our US President and team did and their outcome.

Cooling Your TC

If your TC runs hot there are a few things to consider.

Timing should be set correctly. Timing being off will cause the engine to run hotter. Ditto if cam timing is off too.

Don't put in too much antifreeze. Water absorbs and transfers heat much better than coolant. Here in Southern California for the most part we don't require protection from freezing, but the antifreeze does have some corrosion protection as well.

Most of us have no problems with our copper radiators, but do know that aluminum radiators can transfer heat better.

Some TC owners have resorted to a fan blade set with more blades for greater air flow. And you will get greater air flow when in stop & go traffic, but if cruising on the highways and back roads, vour movement through the air is plenty (assuming radiator fins are not blocked or damaged).

In looking at the photo here of a cylinder head sectioned, note the flashing in the cooling passages. These old castings will have cooling passages that are rough and have flashing creating more resistance to

flow. Fluid moving through the passages have to deal with forces of adhesion, cohesion, and surface tension too. Using a water wetter solution can help water flow better, and better flow means more heat transfer.

Speaking of water passages, crud can build up and settle inside. May need to flush the system and even pull the core plugs so you can blast out better.

Be sure your thermostat is opening as designed. If it goes bad and does not open,



then your system will be blocked and will overheat.

So there are a lot of things you can do to help your cooling but be careful that you are not masking a problem that is causing your TC to run hot in the first place. I for one have a mostly stock cooling system and engine experiences no heating issues from unknown causes. The only times I have overheated, is when a leak has occurred and coolant became low. The only thing I have over stock is a water pump with more blades on it, but almost all new or rebuilt pumps now come with extra blades.




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
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
