


Instead of touring the castle, few of our gang choose to instead visit friends in the area or do other sight seeing in the lovely surrounding area.

Fusing a TC

If you ever looked at the original TC wiring, most circuits are not fused, Those include most (but not all) lighting, starter, clock, ignition and charging circuits. There are only two fuses on a TC. One protects the horn and the other together protects the fog lamp, brake lamp, and wiper motor.

The horn draws roughly 13 amps by itself and the other three draw around 10 amps combined.

So why were the original fuses rated at 35 amps? The British rate fuse amps differently. While an amp is an amp everywhere, the British chose to indicate the surge figure of when the fuse would blow quickly. It would handle 17 amps continuously but blow quickly at 35 amps. American made fuses (SFE) are rated at the continuous figure.

SFE Fuse Amp Rating


So bottom line, buy a 35 amp British Fuse or a 17 amp American fuse (SFE or BUSS). You probably will not find a 17 amp American fuse but you should be OK with a 15 amp rating. If you buy an American fuse, you still get a slow blow as well as that is just the nature of fuses. Looking at the SFE graph you will notice a 20 amp SFE fuse will blow at 45 amps after 1 second. Following the 20 amp curve, it also shows the fuse can handle about 400 amps for a hundredth of a second as well as about 28 amps for about 100 seconds.

If you use a SFE 15 amp fuse and follow a hair to the right of the 14 amp curve, the fuse should be quite safe for extended periods at 15 amps but last only about 5 seconds at approximately 37 amps.

Something else to consider is most fuse

ratings are measured at 25°C (77°F) where the fuse is located. Higher temps can drop the ratings down some. I wonder how warm it is under the bonnet where the TC regulator (and fuses are)?

Should you fuse other TC circuits? No harm if you do. Just looking at the panel for TC 6110 on page 3 of this issue, it has 6 fuses there (and maybe the original two on the regulator are also in play). If you were worried, you could always add separate in-line fuses for other circuits.


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
