





I am new to British cars, and decided a TC was one of the most iconic designs and had decent parts availability so why I chose it. I like working on cars, so wanted a project. The specific car, which has been off the road since at least 1974, is in worse shape than I thought when buying it. Looks like everything needs to be rebuilt or replaced. The body tub wood and metal are in poor condition, but held together to remove it. Chassis has been damaged some and partially repaired so needs more attention. The engine had some rebuild machine work done already.

Debatable whether this car should be resurrected or used as a parts car. I'm proceeding toward resurrecting it, but remaining open to a different project. TC was imported to U.S. in 1969 to Tennessee. Engine tag is a "Replacement Engine" tag and unclear when the engine was replaced. Have owned the car since 2017 and slow at starting serious restoration work. Tub just came off recently.



Dean bought this TC in December. Was owned by Gordon & Mimi Glass for 35 years and then sold on Bring-a-Trailer in April 2023 to Richard Loe. Richard really didn't need another TC and then agreed to sell it to Dean when he heard Dean was looking for one.
















November 28th, TCMG Meeting Minutes


