



TC Oil Pan Baffle

While I would not consider this a must have item, there are so many issues with some cars and oil distribution, and since I have the entire engine apart for a complete rebuild, adding a baffle to the oil pan seemed to be worth the effort

As you can see from the pictures the baffle is just less than the height of the removable plate in the pan, and is bolted to the front of the pan and the horizontal plate with ¹/₄" button bolts. The rear bolt is sealed with a copper

washer and RTV silicone and both nuts are brazed to the baffle.


The baffle is offset slightly to one side to clear the oil drop tube which is attached to the rear main bearing cap- I left my tube in place, although they are often shortened or removed completely. The bottom of the baffle has two notches about ³/₄ by 2 inches to allow a free flow of oil across the bottom of the pan.





Doug Schirripa came across this fortune cookie appropiate for British car owners.

Lesson Learned

Bryan Kemper put in the oil pan baffle and then fitted the pan. He then discovered he forgot the oil slinger on the front of the crank shaft. I think we have all done something like that on different assemblies. So he pulls the pan off to correct and discovered excess silicone sealant had partially blocked the oil opening in the block. He said the ring lifted out without resistance (once the pan was off) but he thought we all could learn something here. Be careful on how much sealant you are using at various locations. Here the sealant probably would have eventually dislodged


and would have been sucked up into the oil





pump gears. Most likely would not have done much harm as the sealant is very soft, and once past the pump, the oil filter would have caught the particles. But something for all of us to be aware of for sure.




Dues for everyone is \$25
