


Jim Sullivan June 1939 -Sept 10, 2025

Ernie Page Buys Another TC

Some of the general research found:

One retired officer who drove MGs on the traffic department in the late 50's and 60's said his father did the same before him in the 40's. He recalls his father's tales of escorting convoys of ammunition and soldiers to and from the Kent Ports during WW2. Also chasing 'Ton up Boys' (as he calls them) who were pilots at local fighter squadrons based in Kent. He said that although the pilots used the same MGs as the police, the police vehicles were faster. He believed the police MGs had balanced engines, hardened cranks and piston bores and highly tuned.

The owner of another former police TC said he found markings on the crank with name of engineer responsible for that engine. Engine was torn down after 28 years and found to be in excellent condition inside.

Ernie sold the two TC's he had and regretted letting the last one go. So he bought another. This one was a former police TC Former owner did some research and found out at least some of the police TCs had balanced engines and at a higher state of tune.



He apparently never double checked it and error just carried over from year to year and also got in the world wide register wrong.

The meeting concluded at 6:35 pm and we moved on to the evenings program.




