

It's nice to finally have not only the knowledge and experience, but a garage to work in, the correct tools for the job and spare parts on the shelf. What luxury compared to when I was a kid working in a gutter! Especially when the neighbor's sprinklers were running.

By the way, the car wouldn't start because I forgot to put the rotor back in the distributor. I certainly never made that mistake several more times...






